When a locum tenens provider agrees to take an assignment, and the client accepts them, we consider the position filled. Locum tenens providers should only accept a position they actually intend to work. When a provider cancels or backs out, it can have a devastating impact on the communities we serve. For instance, a medical facility in a remote location in Alaska cannot simply replace a provider on short notice and a cancellation may leave them without any medical support.



PROFICIENCY IN TECHNOLOGY

Even the most remote facilities now use electronic medical records (EMR) or electronic health records (EHR) systems. Having experience with a variety of EMR and EHR systems, and the ability to quickly learn and adapt to new systems, gives the locum tenens provider a significant advantage. You may also need to collect and process your own labs, read and interpret an x-ray, and/or run a piece of equipment you have not run before.



ORGANIZATIONAL SKILLS

Last, but not least, a locum tenens provider should make sure that all licenses, certifications, and curriculum vitae are up to date and easily accessible as an electronic PDF copy.
